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

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Disability Finance and Operations Skillset

Aim of the program

This skillset aims to provide participants with the skills and knowledge to meet the financial responsibilities of a frontline leader in the disability sector including services to both National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) and fee-paying clients, developing and monitoring implementation of operational plans to support efficient and effective workplace practices and organisational productivity and profitability and managing business risks in a range of contexts across an organisation or for a specific business unit or area.

Learning outcomes

On completion of the program you will have studied the skills and knowledge to responsibly manage a budget within the competitive pressures of the disability sector, understand how decision making should align with business objectives and support improved customer outcomes and comply with legislative, regulatory and procedural requirements of the NDIS and manage business risks.

Structure of the program

There are three units of competency in this skillset and a Statement of Attainment will be issued on the completion of these units.

Accreditation and recognition

The *Disability Finance and Operations Skillset* in which you are enrolled is a nationally recognised and accredited program, listed on the national register of programs.

The competencies gained through successfully completing this program are cross-industry and nationally recognised. You may exit from this qualification at any time with a Statement of Attainment for any units of competency successfully completed to that point.

Furthermore, depending on circumstances related to the type and degree of credit sought, should you go on to enrol in and successfully complete either the Diploma of Leadership in Disability Services 11076NAT or Diploma of Leadership and Management BSB50420, you may receive advanced standing into awards at the University of New England (UNE), subject to eligibility.

Study workload

The nominal duration of your enrolment in the *Disability Finance and Operations Skillset* is six months. The time it takes you to achieve the competencies required will depend on the amount of relevant learning and experience you have. Students with a moderate level of relevant learning and experience should be able to complete the program requirements in about 10 hours a week a week of self-directed workplace and individual study over the six month period, as outlined in your study plan. Inexperienced students will likely require more time.

You have up to six months from enrolment to complete the Disability Finance and Operations Skillset. If you fall behind in your schedule, you should contact UNE Partnerships to discuss your progress. An extension to the study period may be available, however additional fees may apply.
